Dear Registrant in a Continuing Medical Education Course:

I am writing because personal information about you that you provided in connection with your registration for a Continuing Medical Education (CME) program at NYU Medical Center between 1999 and the present has been compromised. CDs containing personal information, including your name, title, degree, address, telephone and fax numbers, social security number (if you gave it to us), student ID number, and credit or debit card information (if you paid by credit or debit card), including credit card number, and expiration date, have been discovered to be missing.

Immediately upon learning that the disks were missing, the CME office notified our security department. The New York City Police Department was notified and conducted an investigation on the premises. Despite diligent searching, we have been unable to locate the disks or information about where they may be.

We deeply regret that this unfortunate situation occurred, and we sincerely apologize for any concern or inconvenience that it may cause.

We understand that you may be concerned about personal privacy and identity theft. We suggest that you contact one of the three credit reporting agencies listed below to put a "fraud alert" on your credit record.

This service is provided free of charge and notifies potential lenders that they should verify your identity before granting new credit under your name. When you call, you will be asked to provide personal identifying information. Once one company receives your fraud alert, the information will be forwarded along to the others. You will receive a free credit report from each of the three reporting companies within 7 to 10 days. Please note that a fraud alert notice may slow the issuance of new credit.
