To Whom It May Concern:

This letter is sent on behalf of the parties identified on Exhibit A hereto (the "Employers") in compliance with applicable consumer protection legislation that provides for notification to individuals and credit reporting agencies of certain unauthorized disclosure of personal or financial information.

Exponent Technologies, Inc. provides payroll, benefits and related human resources services for various companies, including the Employers. A laptop computer that contained employee data, including personally identifiable and financial information (including the names, addresses and social security numbers of employees) was recently taken from Exponent's office. Although access to the computer data is password protected, it is possible that the security measures could be compromised. Exponent has notified local law enforcement of the incident and instituted more stringent security safeguards to prevent a recurrence.

To help individuals protect themselves against the possibility of identity theft, we are in the process of sending notification to those individuals whose personal information may have been compromised. A more detailed listing of those individuals is attached hereto as Exhibit B. A sample notification letter in substantially the same form that will be sent to all individuals is attached hereto as Exhibit C. These notifications will be distributed to the individuals throughout the months of March and April of this year. In the notification we recommend that the individual place a fraud alert on his/her credit files by calling any one of the three credit reporting agencies at one of the numbers listed below.



Exponent Technologies, Inc. provides payroll, benefits and related human resources services for various companies, including _____ (employer) _____. A laptop computer containing personally identifiable employee data (including the names, addresses, social security numbers and dates of birth of [specify number] of _____ (employer) _____ employees [and, if applicable, spouses and dependents] was recently taken from Exponent Technologies' office. Although access to the computer data is password protected, it is possible that the security measures could be compromised. Exponent Technologies has notified local law enforcement of the incident and instituted more stringent security safeguards to prevent a recurrence.

To protect yourself from the possibility of identity theft, we recommend that you place a fraud alert on your credit files. A fraud alert lets creditors know to contact you before opening new accounts. Just call any one of the three credit reporting agencies at one of the numbers listed below. This will let you automatically place fraud alerts with all of the agencies. You will then receive letters from all of them, with instructions on how to get a free copy of your credit report from each.

When you receive your credit reports, look them over carefully. Look for accounts you did not open. Look for inquiries from creditors that you did not initiate. And look for personal information, such as home address and Social Security number, that is not accurate. If you see anything you do not understand, call the credit reporting agency at the telephone number on the report. If you do find suspicious activity on your credit reports, call your local police or sheriff's office and file a police report of identity theft. Remember to get a copy of the police report. You may need to give copies of the police report to creditors to clear up your records.

Even if you do not find any signs of fraud on your reports, we recommend that you check your credit reports periodically for the next year. For more information on identity theft, we suggest that you visit the Web site of the Federal Trade Commission at www.consumer.gov/idtheft.
